**Affidavit of Denise Gastaldo**

I, Denise Gastaldo, of the City of Toronto, Province of Ontario, make oath and say as follows:

1. I hold the degrees of BScN, MA, and PhD, and am a nurse and health scientist with a postdoctoral fellowship from the Université de Montréal. Since 1999 I work at the University of Toronto where I currently hold the position of associate professor at the Bloomberg Faculty of Nursing. Since 2010 I am also the associate director of the Centre for Critical Qualitative Research. I am cross-appointed to the Dalla Lana School of Public Health (University of Toronto), to the Universitat de les Illes Balears (Mallorca, Spain) and to the City University (London, UK). As a researcher, my studies focus on migration as a social determinant of health. Since 2006, I have been studying undocumented workers in Ontario, being funded twice, in 2007 and 2009, by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research to undertake research in this field.
  
2. Additional information on my qualifications and a list of my publications are presented in a summarized curriculum vitae attached hereto and marked as exhibit "A".

3. I set out below my opinion on the implications of denying undocumented migrants access to the Interim Federal Health Benefits Program on the grounds of their immigration or citizenship status, particularly when their lives are placed at risk by such denial. Several paragraphs of this document are taken from a publication I have written with my co-investigators, Dr. Lilian Magalhães and Christine Carrasco (2010), which is referenced below.

**Magnitude of the issue internationally and in Canada:**

4. Over the past decade, undocumented migration has become the fastest growing form of migration worldwide, with undocumented workers comprising its largest group, presently estimated at 30 to 40 million people or 15 percent of the global workforce (Benach, Muntaner, & Santana, 2007; Papademetriou, 2005). Although undocumented migration has become an issue of high international relevance, in Canada, undocumented migrants are mainly an unknown group.

5. There are no accurate figures representing the number or composition of undocumented migrants residing in Canada. A “guesstimate” of about half a million has been proposed nationally (Papademetriou, 2005; Soave Strategy Group, 2006). In 2003, Ontario's Construction Secretariat purported that there were 76,000 non-status immigrants in Ontario's construction industry alone, while other sources confirmed that at least 36,000 failed refugee applicants had never been deported, and another 64,000 individuals overstayed their work, student or visitor visas in 2002 (Jimenez, 2003). If it is assumed that workers are accompanied by family, the numbers in Ontario alone would rise to the figure previously estimated for all of Canada. My own studies reveal that some industries are highly receptive to this kind of worker: food production factories, hospitality, cleaning, and construction, all representing very large contingents of workers. Economically, in 2006, the construction industry represented 9.5% of Canada's total GDP ("Through the Back Door", 2006, December).

**Defining undocumented migrants and their migratory process:**

6. In Canada, the majority of currently undocumented migrants initially enter through authorized legal channels, including as refugee claimants, sponsored immigrants, or as individuals with

valid student, work, or visitor visas (Calavita, 2006; Goldring, Berinstein, & Bernhard, 2007; Oxman-Martinez et al., 2005), but fall out of status for a variety of reasons, such as overstaying their visas, losing a sponsor or a visa-dependent job, or receiving a negative decision in a refugee application.

7. One of the effects of the intensification of globalization in the last two decades has been a call for the migration of cheap, flexible, and mobile labour to high-income countries. This phenomenon was not accompanied by changes in regulatory migration provisions in host nations, leading into the undocumentedness of large groups of workers who do not have a legal pathway to regularize their status. In addition, many circumstances in migrants' countries of origin remain unchanged making it difficult for them to return (e.g. lack of jobs, death threats, family dependence on remittances) (Gastaldo & Magalhaes, 2010).

#### **Undocumented migrants' access to health care in Canada:**

8. Undocumented migrants are, in their majority, young and healthy workers. Given their undocumented status in Canada, they usually live in fear of deportation and avoid utilizing the health care system. In my current study, participants in need of health care paid out of pocket for walk-in clinic consultations and just in very severe cases went to emergency departments, usually referred by a physician. In her 2011 study, Campbell explains that access to health care was often sought through emergency departments only when the problem was so severe that the person feared for his or her life. Hynie (2010) reports that in 2007 only 0.45% of emergency room visits in the Greater Toronto Area were by people without health insurance (which comprises a much larger group than undocumented migrants).

9. Contrary to popular belief and legal prerogative, scientific literature reveals that there are barriers that limit or impede undocumented migrants' ability to receive adequate medical attention in Canada even in emergency situations. Undocumented migrants are frequently denied care on the basis of citizenship or are commonly required to pay higher than provincial plan (OHIP) fees for health care, a reason that leads some to leave emergency rooms untreated. Hynie (2010) states that, despite evidence of greater severity of disease, those without insurance are less likely to receive care and less likely to be admitted to a Greater Toronto Area hospital than

the insured population. Caulford and colleagues (2006) also describe denial of care, citing it often occurs at hospital emergency rooms and that women at advanced gestational stage report being turned down from health care facilities. In my current study, a poignant case is that of a worker who lost a finger while working at a construction site and was given \$500 dollars by his employer under the condition that he would not return to work. It is very unlikely that this amount would ever cover hospitals fees for emergency treatment and subsequent costs related to rehabilitation.

10. Another problem to be considered is the inadequate and expensive option that emergency care represents to address undocumented migrants' health care needs. In many circumstances, prevention, early intervention, and monitoring chronic conditions are much more efficient approaches, which minimize unnecessary physical, mental and social suffering, costs, and satisfy health care professionals' standards of practice.

11. Canadian health care professionals are impacted ethically because they face the difficult dilemma of fulfilling their professional moral duty or following organizational policies that deny access to uninsured people. In Canada, physicians have the "responsibility to promote fair access to health care resources" and should not discriminate against patients on grounds of national origin and socioeconomic status (Canadian Medical Association, p. 2, 2004). Nurses alike must follow these ethical guides in addition to other responsibilities, such as "expanding the range of health-care choices available", recognizing that geographic and economic factors lead to inequity, and take action to overcome barriers to health care experienced by vulnerable and disadvantaged groups (Canadian Nurses Association, p. 21, 2008). Policies regarding care provision are made by administrators and politicians, but their operationalization is carried out by front-line staff and research suggests that this decision occurs with enough frequency that it has elicited considerable concern and distress among health care providers. (Khan et al, 2010; The Lancet, 2007).

### **Conclusion:**

12. Despite the fact that people residing in Canada without legal status seldom use the health care system, in critical situations they have been denied emergency care. The effect on

undocumented migrants who are unable to afford health care and become ill, of being able to apply for assistance from the Interim Federal Health Benefits Program would be to give those with complex and/or severe health conditions, such as victims of work accidents, access to needed, not elective, health care. Such access also would provide their employers and health care providers an avenue to address health care needs in the most efficient and effective manner, creating better working conditions that would allow health care professionals to fulfil their non-discriminatory caregiving role.






