I acknowledge receipt of your motion for extension of time and motion for reconsideration of the decision of the Supreme Court of Canada rendered on April 5, 2012, dismissing your application for leave to appeal to this Court.

I wish to advise you that Rule 73 of the *Rules of the Supreme Court of Canada* states that there shall be no reconsideration of an application for leave to appeal unless there are exceedingly rare circumstances that warrant consideration by the Court. It also specifies that a motion for reconsideration must include an affidavit setting out the exceedingly rare circumstances of the case that warrant consideration by the Court and an explanation of why those circumstances or facts were not raised earlier in the proceedings.

I have reviewed your motion for reconsideration and your affidavit in support. I regret to inform you that, in my opinion, your motion does not reveal the exceedingly rare circumstances which would warrant reconsideration by this Court. Furthermore, please note that Rule 78 of the *Rules of the Supreme Court of Canada* is not applicable to this matter. As a result, your motion for reconsideration cannot be accepted for filing.

Since your application for leave to appeal was dismissed and your motion for reconsideration cannot be accepted for filing, there are no further remedies available to you in the Supreme Court of Canada in this matter and it is no longer within the jurisdiction of this Court. This file is therefore closed and no further documents will be accepted for filing.
